

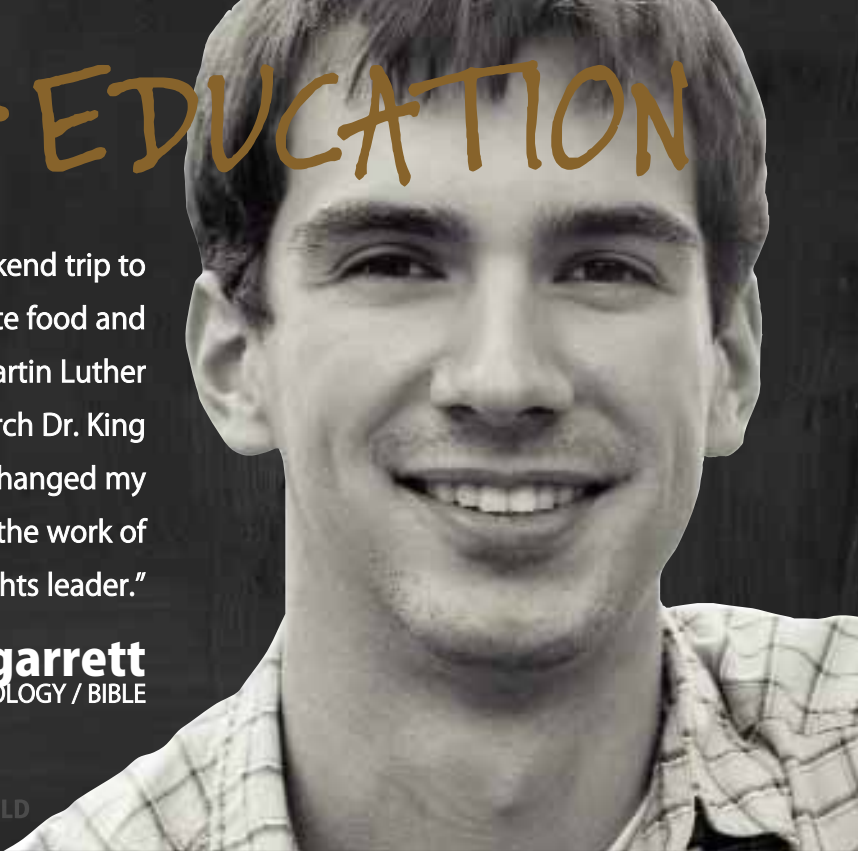
EYE OPENING EDUCATION

Curriculum

Human relationships are the focus of the Social Learning Area at Milligan. **History** majors examine human relationships across time and within regional, national, and international boundaries. **Psychology** majors examine human relationships that focus on self and others. **Sociology** majors examine the relationships within and among groups of the world, **Public Leadership & Service** majors examine these relationships from an interdisciplinary approach, and **Child Life** majors study family systems and child development to become members of clinical teams in hospital settings.
