

## Milligan College Academic Dishonesty Policy

Academic dishonesty (the intentional misrepresentation of all or part of one's work to deceive for personal gain, or assisting another to do the same) is a serious offense which undermines the bonds of trust and honesty between members of the college community and defrauds those who may eventually depend upon our knowledge and integrity. Since academic dishonesty is related to a student's class work, the appropriate response is vested in the professor or academic administrator, as follows. Depending upon the nature and extent of the offense, the student may receive a failing grade on the work in progress or a failing grade in the course. Incidents of flagrant academic dishonesty may be referred to the College Discipline Committee for resolution. In all cases, the professor will notify the student, in writing, of the offense and the sanction. A copy of the notification will be provided to the Vice President for Academic Affairs, who will inform the Vice President for Student Development. With the exception of cases referred to the Discipline Committee, the student may request further hearing via the Academic Grievance Procedure. (Student Handbook 132)
